Course Description:

This course seeks to introduce students to the basic knowledge and image of Japanese history. We will study from the middle of *Edo* period to the beginning of *Meiji* period. By the end of the course students should be familiar with important events in these periods of Japanese history.

Grading: Grades will be determined based on the following criteria:

Attendance 10%

Regular attendance and active participation expected.

Written Responses 20%

A one paragraph statements as to questions regarding some topics or some fill-in-the-blanks-type questions, which I'm giving you in class should be submitted by the due dates. Please email me the one paragraph statements as an attachment in MS Word format (all one paragraph statements must be typed and double-spaced). The one paragraph statements should be brief (at most 300 words (E)/ no limit (J)) (there is no need to be polished well, but need to stick to the point). The points given to the statements written in Japanese become 1.5 times higher than ones in English.

Presentation 20%

The topic should be related to historical events/ historical figures/ social system/ policies of the periods that we're leaning in this semester. More information and criteria on the presentation will be provided as the day gets closer.

Final Exam 50%

Open-book exam. You may bring any references you need. I'm giving you 1/2 question(s) in advance and you can make a draft and bring it to the exam.

Grade Scale:

100 - 85 = 5 (Excellent), 84 - 70 = 4 (Very Good), 69 - 55 = 3 (Good), 54 - 40 = 2 (Sufficient) Below 39 = F
