

Josip Novakovich emigrated from Croatia at the age of 20. He has published a novel, *April Fool's Day* (in ten languages), three story collections (*Infidelities: Stories of War and Lust*, *Yolk* and *Salvation and Other Disasters*) and three collections of narrative essays as well as two books of practical criticism, including *Fiction Writers Workshop*. He edited *Stories in Stepmother Tongue*, a collection of short stories written by non-native English speakers in English. His work was anthologized in *Best American Poetry*, the Pushcart Prize collection and O. Henry Prize Stories. He has received the Whiting Writer's Award, a Guggenheim fellowship, the Ingram Merrill Award and an American Book Award, and in 2013 he was a Man Booker International Award finalist. Novakovich has been a writing fellow of the New York Public Library and has taught at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, Die Freie Universität in Berlin, Penn State and now Concordia University in Montreal.
