

## **The Eastern Adriatic Region in Late Antiquity and the early Middle Ages**

**Short description:** The course aims to provide comprehensive knowledge of the principal historical processes in the eastern Adriatic region (the Croatian coastal area with neighbouring areas and the hinterland including the southern Pannonian region) during late antiquity and the early middle ages. Students will be thoroughly acquainted with political, social, religious and cultural history of the eastern Adriatic region from the 6th to the 12th centuries, with emphasis on cultural interactions and exchanges. Students will receive a thorough insight into various aspects of late antique and medieval history of the eastern Adriatic region based on modern historiographic interpretations, with an overview of the principal primary sources.
